What is SEPAG?

- A Special Education Parent Advisory Group, or SEPAG, is a state-mandated, district-level, parent-driven group.
- It is charged with providing input to the local school district on system-level challenges in special education and related services.

Why Join SEPAG?

- Is your child a different learner?
- Does he/she have an IEP or receive special services through the Special Education department?
- We would like to invite you to become more active in your child's education by joining SEPAG.
- SEPAG provides parents the opportunity to provide input to the school in regard to matters pertaining to students with disabilities.



What is the purpose and function of SEPAG?

A SEPAG gives parents the opportunity to provide direct input to the district about policies, programs, practices and services that impact students with disabilities and their families.





Who can be in SEPAG?

Parents: The Heart of SEPAG

- Parents are the cornerstone members of a SEPAG, representing children with disabilities enrolled in schools within or outside the district.
- Membership is open to parents of children with Individualized Education Programs (IEPs), regardless of their background or training.

Other Potential Members Include:

- School Leaders: Director/Supervisor of Special Services, School Administrators
- Educators: General Education Teachers, Special Education Teachers
- Support Team: Child Study Team Members, School Professionals
- Student Involvement: Students, Former Students
- Dedicated Parents: Other parents committed to improving education in their district
- Community Engagement: Community leaders and other citizens

What SEPAG *IS...*


- Parent Driven/Led
